Dear Friends in Christ,

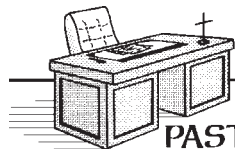

### **FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

Last month I toured the new campus of Lutheran High School in Kansas City ([www.lhskc.com](http://www.lhskc.com)), where two of my sisters are on the faculty. Until recently this beautiful, sprawling complex of over 140,000 square feet of buildings on 29 acres was the home of a mega-church

with over 4,000 members. No one with LHS knows the whole story, but for some reason this church dropped very quickly from thousands to a handful of members. The remnant sold their former church campus—which included a complete parochial school—to LHS for a fraction of its value, complete with all of its elaborate equipment, furnishings and fixtures.

It was very surreal touring this huge facility, because the mega-church apparently declined so quickly that they just walked off and left many things behind just as they were. A series of large classrooms for adults were all still set up, with lecture notes still on the whiteboards, papers and pens scattered on the tables, and in each room a serving table with half empty coffee pots, cups, etc. left from the last time these rooms were used over a year ago. Classrooms in the former preschool were stacked with toys and some children's cubbies still held coats. The massive former church office complex—a staff directory posted by a phone showed over 75 former employees—will be emptied of its maze of cubicles to become the new library for one of my sisters, who is the LHS librarian. The desks of former workers looked like they had just stepped away.

The rapid, impressive growth, and then even more rapid, devastating decline of this mega-church, reminded me of the cottonwood trees that we have in Dakota Dunes and in my home state of Kansas. I can remember my father explaining that cottonwoods are soft, and break so easily, because they grow so fast.

There is an example of this by Prairie Park near our home. Over the past few years several major branches have gradually broken off a very large cottonwood. They are trying not to cut it down, but soon they will have no choice. Like that mega-church, such

fast-growing trees can become beautiful, large and impressive—for a time. But, they don't last as long as slower-growing hardwood trees, such as oaks.

While we certainly want our own congregation to grow, we also want that growth to be lasting like an oak, firmly rooted in and nourished by God's Word and Sacraments. Jesus puts it this way in the Parable of the Sower:

"Listen then to what the parable of the sower means. When anyone hears the message about the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what was sown in his heart. This is the seed sown along the path. The one who received the seed that fell on rocky places is the man who hears the word and at once receives it with joy. But since he has no root, he lasts only a short time. When trouble or persecution comes because of the word, he quickly falls away. The one who received the seed that fell among the thorns is the man who hears the word, but the worries of this life and the deceitfulness of wealth choke it, making it unfruitful. But the one who received the seed that fell on good soil is the man who hears the word and understands it. He produces a crop, yielding a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown" (Matthew 13:18-23).

Psalm 92:12 says, "The righteous will flourish like a palm tree, they will grow like a cedar of Lebanon." The cedars of Lebanon are not only big, they are also strong and lasting. Not like the cottonwoods prevalent in Dakota Dunes, but like the oaks across the Interstate in Two Rivers. Rooted in and nourished by God's Word and Sacraments, our congregation by God's grace will not only grow like a cottonwood, it will also be spiritually strong and enduring like an oak.

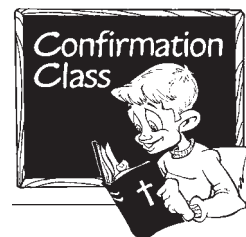

## ***New Stained Glass Windows Dedicated in Entryway***

Our thanks to Ron and Jeannette Yockey for donating the beautiful new stained glass windows in the entryway, in memory and honor of their maternal grandparents, John and Mary Miller and Stewart and Inez Pettit. Following worship on July 30 the congregation assembled in the entryway for the rite of dedication.

When our new sanctuary is constructed these windows will stay in this location to adorn what will become the entrance to our educational wing. Following that theme, the window above the entry features Jesus the Good Shepherd with a group of children. It is reminiscent of one of the oldest Christian hymns, from about 200 A.D., which begins:

*Shepherd of tender youth,  
Guiding in love and truth  
Through devious ways;  
Christ, our triumphant king,  
We come your name to sing  
And here our children bring  
To join your praise.*

(Lutheran Worship #471)

The windows on either side of the entry feature beautiful angels, based on our Savior's words about little children in Matthew 18:10, the verse on which we base the doctrine of guardian angels:

*"Do not look down on one of these little ones. For I tell you that their angels in heaven always see the face of My Father in heaven."*

Finally, on either side of the entry are two Bible verses reminding us of the importance of Christian education:

*"Let the little children come to Me."  
(Matthew 19:14)*

*"Bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord."  
(Ephesians 6:4)*

These windows not only beautify the educational entrance to our church but will also be a lasting testimony to the importance of and reason for all our congregation's educational efforts.

Two LCMS members recently had a “church council” meeting—in outer space! Astronaut Jeffrey Williams (foreground) is NASA science officer and flight engineer with Expedition 13 to the International Space Station. He travelled to the ISS on a Russian spacecraft on March 29, and will be in outer space until September 24. Astronaut Michael Fossum (standing) arrived with his crew on the Space Shuttle *Discovery* on July 4, and they remained until July 17 performing maintenance and upgrades to the ISS. During the mission Fossum participated in a 7½ hour space walk. Williams and Fossum are among five NASA active duty astronauts who are members of Gloria Dei Lutheran Church (LCMS), Houston, which is located just across the road from the space center and where some 30 percent of the congregation’s members are affiliated with the space program.
